



## Capo Tuning Reference Chart

When using a capo, there are a few things to keep in mind before just putting it on the guitar and going right to playing.

1. Always Double Check The Tuning!
  1. Many capos often over tighten the strings, and the result is the strings get pulled out of tune. This will obviously end up making all of your chords sound funky.
  2. Many people find it difficult to figure out what the correct tuning should be, because all of the notes you need to tune to will change after you put the capo on.

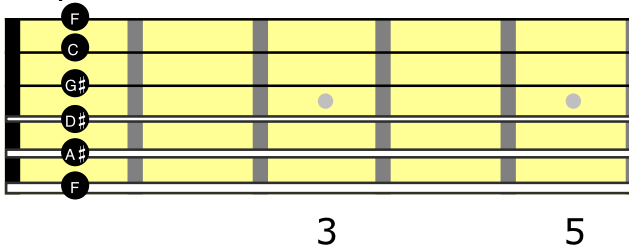
The chart below and on back will help you know what to tune the guitar to after the capo is placed on your guitar.

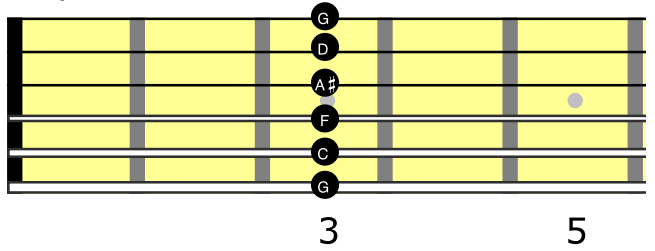
String	<u>E</u>	<u>A</u>	<u>D</u>	<u>G</u>	<u>B</u>	<u>E</u>
Capo on 1	F	A#	D#	G#	C	F
Capo on 2	F#	B	E	A	C#	F#
Capo on 3	G	C	F	A#	D	G
Capo on 4	G#	C#	F#	B	D#	G#
Capo on 5	A	D	G	C	E	A
Capo on 6	A#	D#	G#	C#	F	A#
Capo on 7	B	E	A	D	F#	B

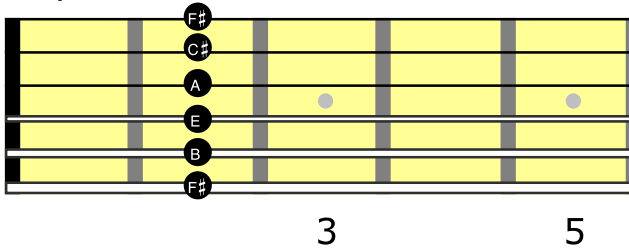
Capo on 1 = F-A#-D#-G#-C-F



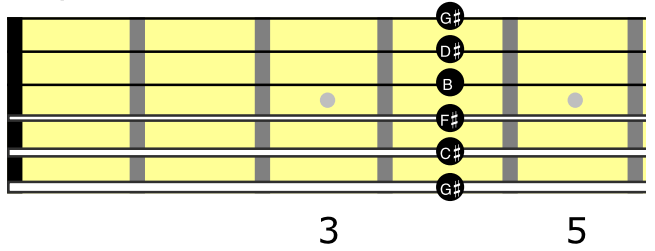
Capo on 3 = G-C-F-A#-D-G



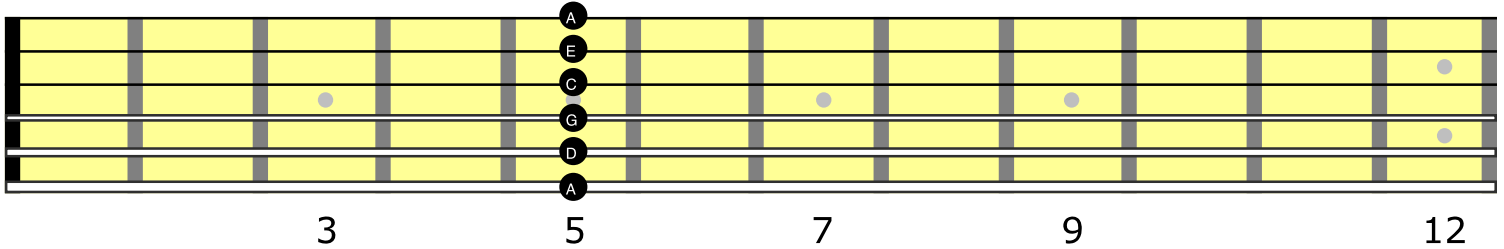
Capo on 2 = F#-B-E-A-C#-F#



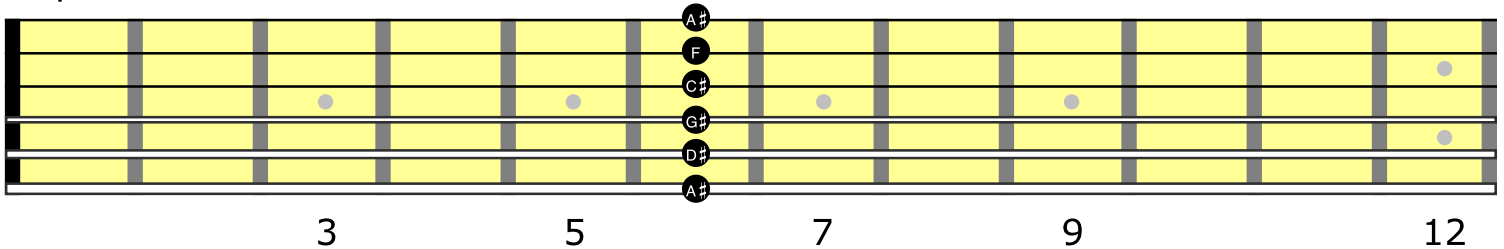
Capo on 4 = G#-C#-F#-B-D#-G#
